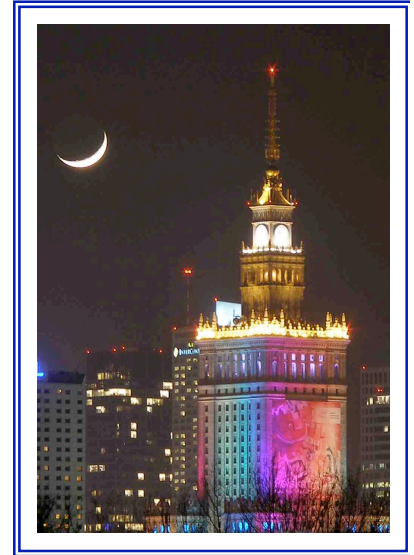


# CEESA CONFERENCE 2012

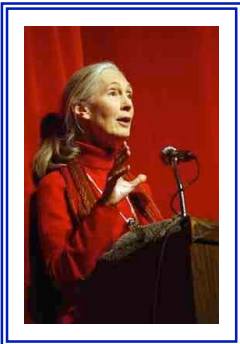

A leading expert in school data use and professional development, Nancy has worked with schools across the country develop Data Coaches and high-performing Data Teams and to put research about effective professional development into practice. As former Director of the National Science

Foundation-funded Using Data Project, Nancy led the design and implementation of a comprehensive professional development program to improve teaching and learning through collaborative uses of school data. Participating schools significantly increased student achievement, teacher collaboration, and uses of data to improve instruction.
